



BUCKS YOUTH CRICKET TRUST SUPPORT 2023: Player Pathway



September 2022 to August 2023: BYCT supported 24 players with the cost of training, match fees and tours, subsiding payments by £2.2k

To make support more accessible for winter training this year we sent out a 20% and 40% discount options, for any players to use who required support, with the option to contact Stuart Beck (BYCT) if a higher level of support was required.

Similarly, for EPP & MTP sessions (that are already over 50% subsidised by Bucks Cricket) we offered a 50% off code with the registration link.

October 2023: BYCT have already supported 40 players with the cost of winter training, subsiding payments by £1.6k (see breakdown in the table below). Other pathway parents donated a total of £420 in October 2023 to support this provision.

COST REDUCTION FOR ALL PATHWAY PLAYERS

Through sponsorship from Wolters Kluwer and a grant from ECB, we were able to reduce the cost to parents of the 2023 summer programme by a total of £30,000.

BYCT then provided further grants to 10 players for summer fees and 3 players for festivals. All nomination/trial sessions were delivered free of cost to players/parents – at a cost of £7k to Bucks Cricket, supported by an ECB grant.








10. In your experience, how would you rate the opportunities for children attending State Schools to play and progress in Cricket within Buckinghamshire? [You can add comments via Question 13]




